

Riverview Homes Completes Manufactured Home Installation Training

Vandergrift, PA – February 4, 2010 – Pennsylvania law requires that any installation work performed on a manufactured home be inspected by a licensed manufactured home installer. The law requires the home be inspected to make sure that it was installed to the manufacturer's installation requirement. To become licensed an individual must complete a 2-day State training course and complete State approved continuing education every 3 years. Doug Rehak, Chairman of the Board of Riverview Homes and a licensed installer explains, "Many service complaints filed by homeowners are later found by the manufacturer to be related to poor installation. Proper installation has always been a key part of Riverview's customer satisfaction and one reason that we use our own set crews and set foreman on every installation job we do." Riverview Homes has taken the intent of the PA law one step further to insure the absolute best possible installation. Mr. Rehak further explains, "Each home built by Riverview Homes has a licensed installer on site while the work is being performed, additionally Riverview sales managers are licensed installer so that installation issues can be discussed during the sales process and to show our complete belief in this system my partner and myself are also licensed. Additionally each home is inspected upon completion by an independent licensed installer. This process helps to assure that every home meets or exceeds the manufacturers installation requirements and helps to insure Riverview's customer's complete satisfaction with their new home."
